

Critical Gender Indicators Checklist

1. Emergency teams include women and men, and you strive to achieve gender balance.
2. Each emergency team has someone focusing on gender.
3. Analyze how the crisis affects women, men, boys and girls differently and any barriers or obstacles facing particularly women and girls are analyzed.
4. Collect data from women, men, boys and girls.
5. The data from women is collected by women.
6. The data you use to measure effectiveness is broken down by sex.
7. Monitor intended and unintended effects of the response on women and men.
8. Women and men participate equally in decision-making.
9. Proposals and reports include specific gender plans, goals, indicators and progress.
10. Consider women's and men's different needs and capacity in project plans and resources.
11. Staff and partners are accountable to gender equality goals.
12. Work to prevent sexual exploitation and abuse and provide medical, legal and economic support to survivors.
13. Have an SGBV referrals system that integrates SGBV issues into the entire response.
